

The Women & Girls Philanthropy Index of Massachusetts


The Women & Girls Philanthropy Index of Massachusetts (WGIMA) is the only comprehensive index that measures charitable giving to women's & girls' organizations in Massachusetts.



Overall charitable giving to Massachusetts nonprofits is **up 7%**.



Charitable giving to local women & girls continues to **decline**.





Massachusetts charitable giving to women & girls' **remains lower than the national average of 1.9%**.





Research Approach: The WGIMA represents the most recent IRS publicly available data for over 1,300 organizations. The WGIMA was developed using the Women's Philanthropy Institute's nationally focused Women & Girls Index (WGI) as a model. The WGI was created with support from the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation. The Women's Foundation reviews and validates this list annually to understand the direct impact of charitable contributions benefiting women and girls living and working in Massachusetts.
